It appearing to the Sessions that Solomon Joiner being sick and unable to attend, he is continued on his recognizance until October Sessions next. Micajah Purdy is bound in the sum of ten pounds for the appearance of Salmon Joiner at the Quarter Sessions in October next.

The Quarter Sessions adjourned until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock.

The Quarter Sessions met at nine o'clock Wednesday morning, pursuant to adjournment. Present: Alexander Fisher, Esq., Bryan Crawford, Andrew Kimmerly, Reuben Bedal, Jacob B. Chamberlain, Daniel Wright, John Embury, Cornelius Vanalstine.

The Grand Jury came into court and presented a bill of indictment against Conrad Vandusen. Also a bill of indictment against Caleb Raymond.

The Sessions respite the recognizance of Conrad Vandusen, Samuel Rowe and Henry Thorpe until next January Sessions.
