¹ The 1861 census of the Town of Whitby contains the listing of 14 year old Mary Ann Newson, born in Upper Canada. She is in the family of mason John Newson (41) and his wife Elizabeth (33). John Stevenson of Whitby East, born in Whitby East to John and Harriet Stevenson, married Mary Ann Newsome, 23, of Whitby, born in Whitby to John and Elizabeth Newsome, on December 17, 1870, in Oshawa. The 1881 census of Whitby East Twp. contains the listing of farmer John Stephenson (39), his wife Mary (35), and Lillian Stephenson, aged 13. Mary Ann Stephenson, widowed housewife of Whitby East, aged 52 years, died of valvular disease of the heart on March 23, 1900. A family tree on Ancestry states that Elizabeth's maiden name was Sergeant. See Oath #130 for Mary Ann's sister, Jane.

² The 1851 census of Whitby Twp. contains the listing of 7 year old John Stevenson, born in Upper Canada. He is in the family of farmer John Stevenson (45) and his wife Harriet (37). John Wesley Stephenson, yeoman of Whitby East, aged 55 years, died in a threshing accident on August 17, 1897.

³ David Snoddon, 23, of Whitby East Twp., married Lillian N.E. Stephenson, 17, of Whitby East, born in the Town of Whitby to John and Mary Stephenson, on November 6, 1884 in Oshawa. Lillian Mary Snodden, married woman of the Town of Whitby, aged 33 years, died of pulmonary tuberculosis on January 13, 1902.

⁴ The 1871 mortality schedule of Reach Twp. contains the name of Cele Ann Bunting, 22, who died of inflammation in April, 1870. The family of cooper Robert Bunting (45) and his wife Ann (45) appears in the 1871 census of Reach Twp. and they are probably her parents.

⁵ The 1861 census of Reach Twp. contains the listing of 12 year old Mary Ann Holmes, born in England. She is in the family of labourer Francis Holmes (34) and his wife Sarah (31). Henry Craigg, 32, widower of Reach Twp., married Mary Ann Holmes, 22, of Reach, born in England to Francis and Elizabeth Holmes, on June 1, 1871 in Reach. By the time of the 1880 U.S. census, Henry Craig (46), his wife Mary (31), and a family of eight children are in Vassar Twp., Tuscola Co., Michigan. Michigan County marriage records contains the marriage of George S. Meloy, 51, of Fremont, to Mary A. Craig, 52, of Fremont, born in England, on October 27, 1902 in Vassar, Tuscola, Michigan. Maria Meloy, married woman of Vassar, born March 31, 1849 to Frank Holmes and unknown, died of uraemia on December 5, 1914 in Vassar.

⁶ The 1851 census of Whitby Twp. contains the listing of one year old James Finnie, born in Upper Canada. He is in the family of labourer David Finnie (37) and his wife Margaret (36). By the time of the 1871 census of Whitby East Twp., James, aged 19, is still in the same family.

¹ The 1871 census of Oshawa contains the listing of 40 year old John Hyland Jr., carriage maker, born in Quebec [sic]. His wife is Maria (40). Find A Grave states that John Hyland died on April 14, 1904 and is buried in the Oshawa Union Cemetery. It also states that his parents were John Hyland and Ann Collum, and that his wife was Maria Wilson. His death registration states that he was born in Whitby East Twp. and died of spinal meningitis. The book "The Life and Times of Joseph Gould" by W.H. Higgins states on page 125 that John Hyland Sr. was an Irishman who settled in the Township of Whitby between 1812 and 1820.

² The 1871 census of Uxbridge Twp. contains the listing of 21 year old J. Eliza McFall, born in Ireland. She is in the family of widow Eliza McFall (64). Also in the family is 2 year old A. William McFall, born in Ontario.

³ The 1871 census of Pickering Twp. contains the listing of 25 year old James Coulter, born in Ontario. He is in the family of farmer George Coulter (55) and his wife Mary (50).

⁴ The 1861 census of Pickering Twp. contains the listing of 21 year old William Gimblet, born in England. He is in the family of farmer John Gimblet (46) and his wife Mary (47). William Gimlett, 28, of Arthur Twp., Wellington Co., born in England to John and Mary Gimlett, married Margaret Hamilton, 21, of Maryborough, on October 4, 1870 in Arthur. A family tree on FamilySearch.org states that Mary's full name was Mary Ann Smale.

⁵ The 1871 census of Pickering Twp. contains the listing of 24 year old Grace McDonald, born in Ontario. She is in the family of weaver Grey McDonald (54) and his wife Sarah (51). Joseph Goodwin, 34, widower and sailor of Toronto, married Grace McDonald, 37, of Toronto, born in Scotland to Graham and Sarah McDonald, on October 9, 1888 in Toronto. Grace Kerr Goodwin, widow of Toronto, aged 81 years, born in Scotland to Graham MacDonald and Sarah McCullough, died of myocardial degeneration on November 9, 1928.

⁶ Peter Walker, 23, labourer of Pickering, born in Scotland to Peter and Margaret Walker, married Mary Milne, 26, of Pickering, on September 1, 1869 in Whitevale. The 1871 census of Pickering Twp. contains the listing of 26 year old Peter Walker, born in Scotland. His wife is Mary (27) and there is a 3 month old girl in their family. Peter and family are enumerated on the same page as Grace McDonald. Peter Walker, wood saw worker of Guelph, born on March 30, 1846 in Scotland to Peter Walker and Margaret Chapman, died of paresis on November 10, 1910 in Guelph.
